

HOW CHRIST CONDEMNED SIN

There was condemnation of sin in Christ's very look. The Pharisees felt it. By His sinless life they were confronted with their own sinful nature. John 8:3,7

Sin did the most atrocious thing by killing the Son of God. God condemned sin to the utmost by allowing it to condemn itself. Sin murdered the perfect man, and thus convicted itself. So sin is condemned and sentenced to removal from all creation.

Romans 8:3,4 For what the law was powerless to do because it was weakened by the flesh, God did by sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh to be a sin offering. And so He condemned sin in the flesh. That the righteousness of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit.

Matthew 28:18 All authority in heaven and earth has been given to me.

Colossians 1:19,20a God was pleased to have all His fullness dwell in Christ, and through Him to reconcile to Himself all things whether things on earth or things in heaven.

By Christ uniting believers to Himself in newness of life, He gave actual effectiveness to the condemnation of sin by destroying its dominion in the flesh through the life-giving, sanctifying power of the Holy Spirit to those who believe and receive Jesus.
