

DEGREES OF PUNISHMENT ON JUDGMENT DAY

Judgment day for those whose names are not found in the Book of Life results in all to be judged according to the Book of their Works and all will be cast into the Lake of Fire. Revelation 20:11-15

It appears that judgment day will be worse for some than for others. Romans 2:6; Rev. 20:11-15

Luke 10:14; 12:47-48; 20:47

There may be different levels of guilt and shame. Some may have had more opportunities for repentance and kept resisting the conviction of the Holy Spirit. Some may have allowed their actions to be more violent or abusive toward God and man. The mental torment of rehashing decisions over and over in one's mind is painful. There is self-induced anger at not being able to have their way being separated from the common grace of God which gave them freedom to choose their own path. We don't know the length of judgment day but the realization that one stands before his Creator who has power to destroy both soul and body in the lake of fire (Matthew 10:28) lends itself to gnashing of teeth (anger), regret, weeping, agony, and mental torment which has been self-imposed.
